New Mass Schedule beginning Monday, 7/27/20

Beginning Monday, July 27, the following Masses at Blessed Sacrament will be cancelled:

- 8:30 AM daily Mass [Monday through Friday]
- 10:30 AM Sunday Mass
- 12:00 PM First Friday Mass [Latin]
- 9:00 AM First Saturday Mass [Latin]

The following Masses at Blessed Sacrament will continue until further notice:

- 4:00 PM Saturday Vigil Mass [English]
- 8:30 AM Sunday Mass [Latin]
- 12:10 PM Sunday Mass [Spanish]

Daily Masses will be at Little Flower (Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday) at 8:15am and (most) Tuesdays at 5:30pm (Extraordinary Form/EF). Any changes/cancellations to the Tuesday Mass will be in the bulletin. The First Friday EF Mass will be at 6pm and the First Saturday EF Mass will at 8:15am. These two Masses will now be at Little Flower. More will be communicated in the future with regard to these. Confessions will also be heard with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at Little Flower every Thursday from 5-7pm. Benediction will be at 7pm.

Message from Bishop Talley

The dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation presently in effect continues through the 4th of September. In particular, those who are experiencing any sickness, those with any health vulnerability and those fearful of the possible infection of COVID 19 should stay at home.

Guidelines for attending Mass

- No social gathering before OR after Mass
- Must wear a facial mask while in the Church
- Communion "in the hand" recommended
- Continuation of the 6-foot social distance rule
- Every other pew blocked off
- Cry room to remain closed
- Collection baskets will be located near both doors
- Use hand sanitizer before entering the Church
- Stay home if you are ill or have any medical issues
- No non-liturgical meetings in excess of 50 people

Mass Requests

During the transition of Pastors, we are uncertain regarding Blessed Sacrament's Mass schedule in August and thereafter. Therefore, we will not be taking Mass requests for the time being.

The Gospel for the 16th Sunday in OT



Jesus proposed another parable to the crowds, saying: "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everyone was asleep his enemy came and sowed weeds all through the wheat, and then went off. When the crop grew and bore fruit, the weeds appeared as well. The slaves

of the householder came to him and said, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where have the weeds come from?' He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' His slaves said to him, 'Do you want us to go and pull them up?' He replied, 'No, if you pull up the weeds you might uproot the wheat along with them. Let them grow together until harvest; then at harvest time I will say to the harvesters, "First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles for burning; but gather the wheat into my barn."' ... His disciples approached him and said, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds in the field." He said in reply, "He who sows good seed is the Son of Man, the field is the world, the good seed the children of the kingdom. The weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sows them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels. Just as weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all who cause others to sin and all evildoers. They will throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Whoever has ears ought to hear." [Matthew 13:24-43]

Do not sadden the Holy Spirit

Never let evil talk pass your lips; say only the good things men need to hear, things that will really help them. Do nothing that will sadden the Holy Spirit with whom you were sealed against the day of redemption. Get rid of all bitterness, all passion and anger, harsh words, slander, and malice of every kind. In place of these, be kind to one another, compassionate, and mutually forgiving, just as God has forgiven you in Christ. (Ephesians 4:29-32)
