Sanctuary Candle Dedication: Christ is the light of the world.

Candles are used in worship as a reminder of Christ our light and the light in us that is His grace. They are also a symbol of His sacrifice. As the candle burns, it sacrifices itself in order to give light. When we light a candle, we make an offering for a particular intention. The candles that burn before the Blessed Sacrament in red globes are offerings to God for particular intentions. Some of the candles last for 2 weeks and costs \$20. The other candles burn for 1 week and cost \$10. Candle offering envelopes can be found in the votive candle stands or at the office during open hours.

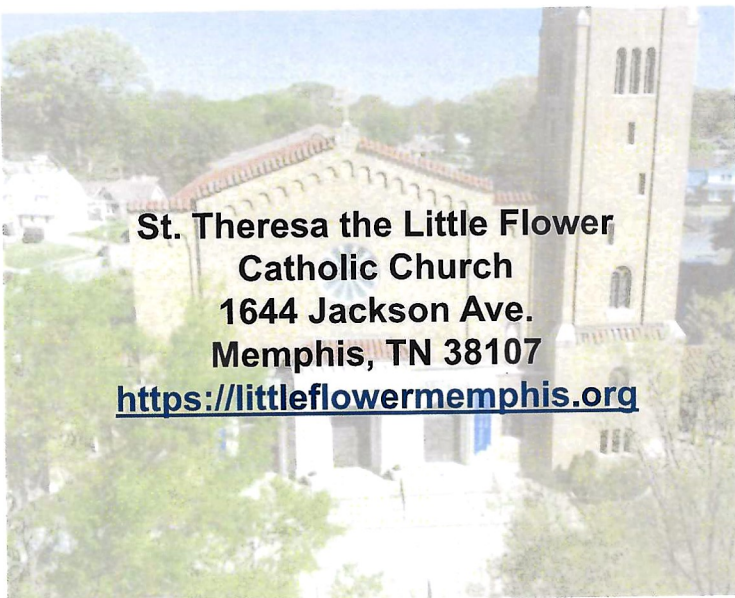

Rogation and Ember Days

ROGATION DAYS

Rogation comes from the Latin *rogare* which means "to ask." Rogation Days are days that we ask for God's mercy and seek to appease His anger and avert His chastisements which are manifest through natural disasters. During Rogation processions, we ask for God's blessings, particularly as it pertains to farming, gardening, and other agricultural pursuits. The days are set aside to remind us how radically dependent we are on the earth, and how prayer and petitioning God and His Saints can help protect us from natural disasters. Rogation Days are a public manifestation of the Christian belief in the power of prayer. Rogation Days were first observed in the sixth century when Pope St. Gregory the Great instituted them after Rome was brought to near desolation by an awful plague during the Easter Season. The pope, knowing that prayer and penance are the true remedies for the evils that befall mankind, led his flock on a procession, chanting litanies and prayers. This was accompanied by a public fast for God to spare them, and God indeed spared His people. While these processions were first observed in the 6th century, they have Old Testament roots. Doing penance, which is an exterior manifestation of our interior disposition, is critical for our spiritual growth. Words from the prophet Joel, which we read at Ash Wednesday's Mass, remind us of the power of penance. Paraphrasing Joel, the prophet exhorts the people to rend their hearts, not their garments and repent, and the Lord, who is slow to anger, will spare His people.

The **Major Rogation occurs on April 25th** and the Minor Rogation is the **Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday before the Ascension of our Lord on Ascension Thursday**. This year the Minor Rogation Days are May 23, 24, 25.

EMBER DAYS

The Church sets aside three days, four times a year, to focus on God through His creation. These four times a year coincide with the God-given seasons: spring, summer, fall, and winter. The days during these four periods are known as Ember Days and are **always on a Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday during each of the four seasons**.

- The spring Ember Days are the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday **after Ash Wednesday** (March 2 in 2022- this is a moveable feast).
- The summer Ember Days are the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday **after Pentecost** (June 5 in 2022-this is a moveable feast).
- The fall Ember Days are the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday **after the Feast of the Holy Cross** (Sept 14),
- The winter Ember Days are the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday **after the Feast of St. Lucy** (Dec 13).

Since the Liturgical calendar begins with Advent, technically winter is the first season, so you can remember Ember days are the Wednesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays following **Lucy, Ashes, Dove, Cross**.

Ember Days are spent fasting and praying. They are spent in penance and with the intention of thanking God for the gifts He gives us in nature and beseeching Him for the discipline to use them in moderation. The fasts, known as *Jejunia quatuor temporum*, or the fasts of the four seasons, are rooted in Old Testament practices of fasting four times a year. Priestly ordinations, prayer for priests, first Communion, almsgiving, and other penitential and charitable acts, as well as prayers for the souls in Purgatory are all customary practices on Ember Days. Note that medieval lore says that during Embertides, the souls in Purgatory are allowed to appear visibly to those on earth who pray for them. Because of the days' focus on nature, they are also traditional times for women to pray for children and safe deliveries. **Upcoming Spring Ember Days**- Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday after *Quadragesima* Sunday (the first Sunday of Lent) are known as Lenten Embertide, which, depending on the date of Easter, can come as early as February 11. These days are associated with the season of Spring (March, April, May). As previously stated, this year Lenten Embertide will be March 9, 11, and 12.

This depiction of a Rogation Procession would have included the priest blessing the fields, asking for God's blessing for a bountiful harvest. In addition to the procession, the Parish would fast and abstain from meat, as well as attend special liturgies which would have contained the Litany of the Saints.
